# Message from Exalted Ruler Jan Cimarossa




Please dress appropriately for the weather including gloves and hats, as we'll be outside for a few hours.

### SPRINGFIELD CARES - CHRISTMAS IS COMING!

This is our most ambitious time of the year where we try to send boxes to as many service members as possible. We would be thrilled to have 100 names. We will need more names to accomplish the mission, BUT we will also need material to send. If you are inclined to help, please secure some of the items on the lists below, both food and non food, so we have a balance of items.

Note: donated items are mailed in the Large Flat Rate Box provided by the USPO so you can imagine how much content is needed to fill 150-200 of these boxes. Keep in mind the "sizes" as packing requires smaller sizes of most items.

### FOOD

Jerky, coffee and filters, boxes drinks, protein bars, dried fruit, canned meat and fruit, nuts, noodles, sardines, gum, hard candy, and items of these sorts, but no bagged chips or crackers as they disintegrate in transit


### NON FOOD

Razors, sunscreen, panty liners, tampons, toothpaste and brushes, dental floss, stationary, games, playing cards, travel size shampoo, cream rinse, body lotion, foot and body powder, baby wipes, lip balm, and other items of this sort.

ITEMS WE CANNOT SEND include batteries, aerosol canned items, anything containing alcohol, lighters, matches, any glass containers, tobacco, cash, etc.
