# **Proposed Bylaw Change**

Proposed Bylaw change read on the floor and approved on March 1st to go to the membership for approval at the March 15, 2023 Membership Meeting at 7 p.m.

LOCAL LODGE 0158 BYLAWS 2021 ARTICLE V: ELECTIVE OFFICERS AND DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY Section 4. Paragraph 6, last sentence. Current bylaw: "For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation \$3,000.00 per annum, payable every two weeks." Proposed change: "For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation \$4,500.00 per annum, payable every two weeks."

OF THE TREASURER ARTICLE V: ELECTIVE OFFICERS AND DUTIES Section 5. Paragraph 1, last sentence. Current bylaw: "...for the faithful performance of his duties, and shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of \$3,000.00 per annum, payable every two weeks." Proposed change: "... faithful performance of his duties, and shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of \$4,500.00 per annum, payable every two weeks."




