Springfield Cares Soldier Mailing November

On Tuesday, October 18th, we met at the TRN club for our monthly packing. 24 Boxes will be headed to military personnel serving in harms way. We had a great turn out of volunteers, and 2 special guests.

SSG Daniel B. brought to us a list of service members stationed in harms way to whom we will be sending packages, particularly in December for our Christmas mailing. Please note we have moved the December mailing date to Wednesday, 12/14 to enable the packages to arrive by Christmas.

Thank you for providing these names which when coupled with names from others will allow us to send 150 or more boxes for Christmas this year.

We also had the leadership group from the RED Ride of Central Illinois attend and participate in the packing. They had a ball, led by 1 year old Nelly, a great time was had by all . These fine folks were not only in attendance to help pack, but also brought us a very significant donation as a result of their August 27th charity fundraising Ride involving over 700 participants. Our mission is greatly enhanced by the donations we receive from the RED Ride and many others.

Let's put in perspective the scope of costs born by volunteers, and the organization. Postage is \$19.95 per box, content averages \$1.25 per item shipped. Our boxes average 20 items, or a content value of \$25.00, coupled with the postage, results in a box cost of approximately \$45.00. Our Christmas mailing will have an out-the-door value of at least \$6,750.00. We are so blessed to have our donors, and volunteers, and the community providing names of Service Members to whom we can mail packages.

We do this every month. Please come out and help. Particularly join us in December for the Christmas mailing as it will be "all hands on deck" to get the boxes assembled and ready to ship.

"TRN Club is currently our host location with help from members of the TRN, Elks Lodge #158, Blue Ridge Club, and other lake clubs, fraternal organizations and businesses. We can't do it without financial assistance and product donations from all of you. Please continue to support our men and women serving in harms way in whatever capacity you are able. 100% of your donations go to them.
