A sign up sheet will be located on the Walnut Room bulletin board, starting Monday, July 29th. If you are interested, please sign up early.





#### **Illinois State Fair**

This month's calendar salutes the Illinois State Fair.

The opening of the first permanently located Fair was September 24, 1894, and it ran for an extent of six days. Admission was 50 cents for adults, seventy-five cents for one person on horseback, and \$1.25 for a carriage load of four.

The Fair has had its home in Springfield for over 100 years. Many buildings on the fairgrounds have also celebrated over 100 years of history in Springfield. For the amount of \$69,500, the Dome Building was purchased from the Chicago World's Fair and was then reconstructed for the 1895 Fair. Tragically, the Dome Building, located just east of the Exposition Building burned down in August, 1917, just before the Fair opened.

Currently, the fairgrounds cover 366 acres.




Charity, the Greatest of all Virtues

wELKome to the official account for the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks USA! With the 150th anniversary of the order taking place in 2018, let us reflect upon the previous 149 years of Elkdom across our great nation!

On February 16th, 1868, a New York actor, Charles A. Vivian, and his colleagues organized a fraternal club known as the "Jolly Corks." The club was created to serve as a loophole around New York alcohol laws, permitting them to consume alcoholic beverages on Sunday.

When one of the original fifteen "Jolly Corks" passed away, leaving behind a family, the fraternal club shifted their focus from just merely sociability to charity as well, providing financial donations for his late family. And thus, Vivian and his group restructured the club as one that is equal parts social, as philanthropic of the community surrounding them. With an 8 to 7 vote, the newly renamed group "The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks" was born.


