As you know, our Lodge has a kitchen that's open every day from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m., and we hope to continue that schedule

There are some changes being implemented to help our lodge continue to grow and serve our members. To help offset current and fast-rising expenses, a 3% surcharge/processing fee, also known as swipe fees, will be assessed on all credit/debit card purchases, effective immediately. Cash purchases will not be assessed this fee and an ATM is on site for your convenience.

SUGGESTED ITEMS TO DONATE:

Razors, shaving cream (NO AEROSOL OR PRESSURIZED PRODUCTS), sun screen, tampons, panty liners, games, tooth paste/brushes, mouth wash, dental floss, envelopes, stationary, white socks (no logos), t-shirts, playing cards, puzzles, shampoo, cream rinse, body lotion, pillow cases, small blankets, twin bed size sheets, base balls, room freshner, baggies, foot powder, baby powder, Ibuprofen (no aspirin), DVD’s, q-tips, baseballs/gloves, baby wipes, lip protection, sunglasses, laundry soaps, fabric softner, bandanas, nix cream, travel size – smaller containers works best. CALENDAR: RECOGNIZING LABOR DAY

Labor Day pays tribute to the contributions and achievements of American workers and is traditionally observed on the first Monday in September. It was created by the labor movement in the late 19th century and became a federal holiday in 1894. Labor Day weekend also symbolizes the end of summer for many Americans and is celebrated with parties, street parades and athletic events.

Labor Day originated during one of American labor history's most dismal chapters. In the late 1800s, at the height of the Industrial Revolution in the United States, the average American worked 12-hour days and seven-day weeks in order to eke out a basic living. Despite restrictions in some states, children as young as 5 or 6 toiled in mills, factories and mines across the country, earning a fraction of their adult counterparts' wages.

Congress passed an act making Labor Day a legal holiday in the District of Columbia and the territories. On June 28, 1894, President Grover Cleveland signed it into law. More than a century later, the true founder of Labor Day has yet to be identified.

DID YOU KNOW that the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks was almost named after the Buffalo instead of the Elk?!

When George F. McDonald brought forth the notion that the Order transition to a benevolent fraternal organization, the members agreed to change the name the Jolly Corks. Thinking of The British Royal Antediluvian Order of Buffalos, Charles A. Vivian, founder of the Order, suggested that the Jolly Corks rename themselves the "Buffalos." However, some members were hesitant, preferring a "distinctively American" symbol and title for their new organization.

In Brother Detweiler's book, he states that the suggestion of the name initially arose from their admiration for a fine elk's head in the Barnum's Museum.



Later, the members visited the Cooper Institute Library where they stumbled across a piece of natural history describing the elk as an animal that is "fleet on foot, timorous of wrong, but ever ready to combat in defense of self." This description of the animal appealed to the members as a fitting representation for their order's mission.

On February 16th 1868, the committee recommended that the Jolly Corks be merged into the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. The motion passed with an 8 to 7 vote.

W.L. Bowron was in favor of the "Buffalo" initially but changed his mind and became the deciding vote. The "Elks" saw victory and Charles A. Vivian had to accept the Elk over the Buffalo.
