A Message from Glenda Cassens: The Elks National Foundation (ENF) has kicked off the 2022 scholarship year:

Most Valuable Student (MVS) Contest:

The 2022 MVS application officially began August 2, 2021. Applications can be found online at <u>enf.elks.org/MVS</u>. The application deadline was November 15⁻2021.

The Elks National Foundation (ENF) awards 500 four-year scholarships based on academics, leadership, and financial need. National awards range from \$1,000 per year to \$12,500 per year. The national awards will announced in April 2022.

MVS scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), at a U.S. college or university next school year. Some important applicant details include:

« Current high school seniors (or equivalent) who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.

- « Applicants do not have to be related to a member of the Elks.
- « Male and female students compete separately.

Legacy Awards – The Legacy Awards program begins on September 1, 2021. Legacy Awards provide \$4,000 scholarships for children and grandchildren of dues-paying Elk members. The ENF offers a total of 350 national *awards*. The application deadline is February 7, 2022. Please visit enf.elks.org/Leg for more details and the application link.

We have plenty in inventory, so please DO NOT bring any donations.




Santa Claus Visits the 158!
