

PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY

The Pearl Harbor Remembrance Ceremony was held on Thursday, December 7, 2023 at 11 a.m.

The Illinois Department of Veterans Affairs in partnership with the Springfield Elks Lodge #158, Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Illinois World War II Memorial Committee, Interveterans Council of Sangamon County, Interveterans Burial Detail, the Lincoln's Challenge Academy, Illinois National Guard, Sons & Daughters of Pearl Harbor Survivors, and a host of others assembled to honor the memory of those who lost their lives that fateful December day, as well as those who lived to tell the story.

State and local leaders held a Pearl Harbor remembrance ceremony at Springfield Elks Lodge #158 Thursday. Many stressed that Americans should never forget what happened on that fateful day.

The room was full of veterans remembering those Americans lost in the early morning of December 7, 1941. Organizers also reserved a special table with empty chairs for the men and women from each of the five services.

"The lives lost, ships destroyed and the planes shot out of the sky in those few hours will forever be etched into the pages of our history," said Past State VFW Commander Bobby Edwards.

The Illinois Department of Veterans Affairs said it is important for every American to understand why we have freedom today. Dozens of Illinoisans lost their lives that day in Honolulu.

"Lt. John Dains was one of the few pilots in Pearl Harbor that was able to get up in the air," said IDVA Director Terry Prince. "If you've seen the movie Pearl Harbor, he could've been Ben Affleck or the other one kind of playing that role where they got up in the air and he actually shot down the first Japanese plane."

Prince joined the Sons and Daughters of Pearl Harbor Survivors in a symbolic wreath laying over Lake Springfield. Many people participating in Thursday's ceremony know that there are fewer survivors and family members alive each year.

"We've had the luxury, and it's been a luxury, of their presence," said John Carrigan, Vice President of the World War II Memorial Committee. "The presence of the greatest generation, I should say, reminds us of the importance of this day. It's so incredibly important, the reminders of the horrors of war."

Edwards said Pearl Harbor's significance extends far beyond the pages of history books.

"The attack on Pearl Harbor shook our nation to its core," Edwards said. "But from the smoldering ashes and destruction arose a sleeping giant with a renewed sense of purpose."

People can also help lay wreaths at Camp Butler National Cemetery in Springfield at 11:00 a.m. on December 16. Wreaths Across America encourages families to bring children and grandchildren to teach the importance of honoring the fallen.

"It is a date that will live in infamy for many. But as the years go on, we have to continue to tell that story to make sure that people know what happened that day," Prince said. "Because life is moving so far, a day which will live in infamy could be put in a bunch of different occasions. But Pearl Harbor was indeed the day."
