



The Elks Hoop Shoot is back on the court for another great season in 2024-25. Hoop Shoot has been unleashing gritty kids for over 50 years. The Elks Hoop Shoot is an annual Free Throw Program for youth ages 8-13; both boys and girls. By the youth working their way up from the local Lodge contest all the way to the National Finals in Chicago. This program is free to the contestants.

Contestants don't have to be the fastest, biggest, or strongest athlete on the court to sink free throws. The Elks National Foundation and the entire Hoop Shoot team nationwide are committed to making the contest fully inclusive, equitable, and safe for all our participants and volunteers.

Contestants must be at least 8 years and no older than 13 years as of April 1, 2025 to participate. Contestants compete in one of six divisions:

Boys, ages 8-9 & Girls, ages 8-9; Boys, ages 10-11 & Girls, ages 10-11; Boys, ages 12-13 & Girls, ages 12-13.

We welcome and encourage all eligible youth to give the Elks Hoop Shoot a shot. A Parental information letter and attachments will be sent out approximately 3 weeks prior to the event.

Each Hoop Shoot contest is so much more than a fun day at the basketball court, but it also provides kids with the opportunity to persevere through adversity experience,



sportsmanship, and accomplishment of their goals.

In addition, volunteers are needed to assist in the areas of judging (6), scorekeeping (4), referees (2), registration (2), and setup. We could use a few extra volunteers to help out in all areas, if needed. Contact me if you're interested.

Stay for our Fall Festival, which starts at 4 p.m. (see Page 9 for more information).







#### **ELKS' HISTORY: Did You Know?**

DID YOU KNOW: The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks today includes a vast number individuals of all demographics across the United States, but the Order originally began as fraternity of men of the theatrical profession or of other activities closely related. For several years after its inception, the Order included this provision in its membership, but as time passed by, membership continually broadened until all walks of life were represented.

Elks of across the different generations hold the theatrical and artistic professions in high regard and appreciation throughout the Order. Ever since Charles A. Vivian and his band of "Jolly Corks" voted to turn their social organization into a benevolent Order, Elks have paid tribute to their thespian Brothers by celebrating, supporting, and continuing to uphold the importance of the arts in American society.

At the Grand Lodge Session in 1895 Grand Exalted Ruler Hay spoke on behalf of the Order's theatrical history:

"The question often arises among uninitiated, concerning the status of the dramatic profession, with regard to the Order. It is true that to the profession the Order in indebted for its existence, but for its perpetuation and for the glory of its members today it depends upon the interested manifested in it by contributions from every walk of life...

...Therefore the Order is heartily and sincerely in sympathy with the profession but I utter the sentiment of the entire Order when I say that everything that should be done to encourage the affiliation that should exist between the profession and the lodges of the Order and without placing upon record any promise to promote in advance the interest of the profession, it should be an unwritten law that will tend toward the upholding, maintaining, encouraging and respecting an art that was espoused by our honored founders."

The following resolution was presented by James J. Armstrong and was adopted by the Order at the Grand Lodge Session of 1895:

"Resolved that the Grand Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks desires to place itself on record as promising to do all in its power to promote and advance the interests and amusement profession and, as far as compatible with laws, to be a factor in relieving distress in said profession, thus carrying out the primary object if its institution."

From 1895 up until today, the Elks have continued to show their support for the arts at the local, state, and national levels, paying their respects to those responsible for the Order's existence.
